15. SUMMARY:

1. This report forwards a narrative written and signed by [redacted] and concerns his sighting of UFO's 23 April 1967. It should be noted report is submitted as an IR since AFR 80-17 is not available this station.

COMMENTS OF REPORTING OFFICER: a. On query, Sr. [redacted] described his portrayal of the zig-zag area (on attached drawing) as representing his conception of the total path of one object which changed direction in rapid succession, producing an explosion or brilliant flash at each change of direction. He thought also that the phenomenon he observed might have had some sort of connection with SOYUZ I which was reported to have crashed 24 April.

b. Source became visibly agitated and excited while recounting the story. He mentioned also that his children were pulling at his elbow to use the binoculars as the two objects he described approached one another. Therefore, he was unable to state whether an actual collision took place or what might have transpired. He knows of no one else besides himself and family who might have seen the objects.

c. This report has been delayed in submission to try to ascertain whether there were other observers. No other observers have been located and no local publicity has been generated on the subject. Source is a responsible citizen, a florist in MIXCO (1439N/090 36W), a small town about 5 miles West of Guatemala City near the Pan American highway. It should be noted Source came in of his own accord after requesting an appointment by phone. He first reported to the MILGP and was referred to DATT/AirA. He was firm about not wanting any publicity as he did not wish to appear foolish or overly imaginative. His desire was simply to report the incident. RO feels he seemed believable; there was no joking about the subject and there is no doubt in mind of RO that Source saw something which was to him unnatural or at the very least highly unusual.

TRANSLATION OF WRITTEN NARRATIVE BY [REDACTED]

Memorandum Concerning Phenomenon Observed Sunday, 23 April
1967 At Approximately 8:00 P. M.

At approximately the hour indicated above, my wife was watering the flowers in the window boxes of our house; I was near a bedroom window which she had left open. She asked me to close the window and when I approached it I was surprised to see the sky so clear and full of stars. At this moment I noticed a star of surprising magnitude; my surprise was even greater when I observed it was moving from the Southwest to the Northeast. Its size was greater than Venus in its most visible periods. I called to my children and to my wife; they saw the star (as we will call the object) which was moving and had a very intense brilliance, with no change of color, giving off a clear yellow light with uniform rays. We ran out to the fields near our house and I carried binoculars (Zeiss) which are very powerful.

As I leaned on a fence to control my nerves, I called out to my children that I saw a star of a dull red color, without the rays which normally appear around a star; it was moving toward the star which had first interested us. At first I thought it was an optical illusion since the other star was also moving in the same direction, but, on training the binoculars on the red star, I noticed it was increasing in size and therefore must be moving. I called out to my children to look at the second star but found it was not visible to the eye and it was also being covered by a cloud. The two stars rapidly approached each other; both appeared to be at the same altitude or height on horizon but the red star was moving faster. On looking again at the area I could only see the large star which had somewhat changed its direction, moving more to the North. (Larger star is the yellow star.) I realized this change of direction later; I did not stop to think about it at the time but when I was reconstructing my observations I remembered it. I did note at the time that the larger star was moving more rapidly but without losing brilliance, and while I was observing it there was no change of color or any flashes.

The drawing attached shows the larger star at the moment I saw multiple red lines moving from one side to the other, making a kind of zig-zag and, at the end of some of these lines, what appeared to be small rays, completely rectilinear, forming small stars of enormous brilliance. The lines were red and the small stars formed at the end of the lines were of a very brilliant clear red color. At this moment the clouds lifted and my wife could see the multiple lights or stars that formed.

In summary, this phenomenon seemed to come from one object which moved rapidly from one place to another, leaving behind a red line which faded out with a sort of flash; it was not like the explosions of fireworks in which there are a number of rocket flashes at the same time.

I believe that the two objects crashed together but, unfortunately, I let my children use the binoculars and tried to direct their vision toward the two stars; also, the observation took place during some 80 seconds so there was no time. I do know that the larger star was already somewhat out of the zone where I saw the explosions when they appeared. It could be that there was some delay in finding the area when my children returned the binoculars, but when I again located it, it was difficult moving fast and had somewhat at jectory. Signed:

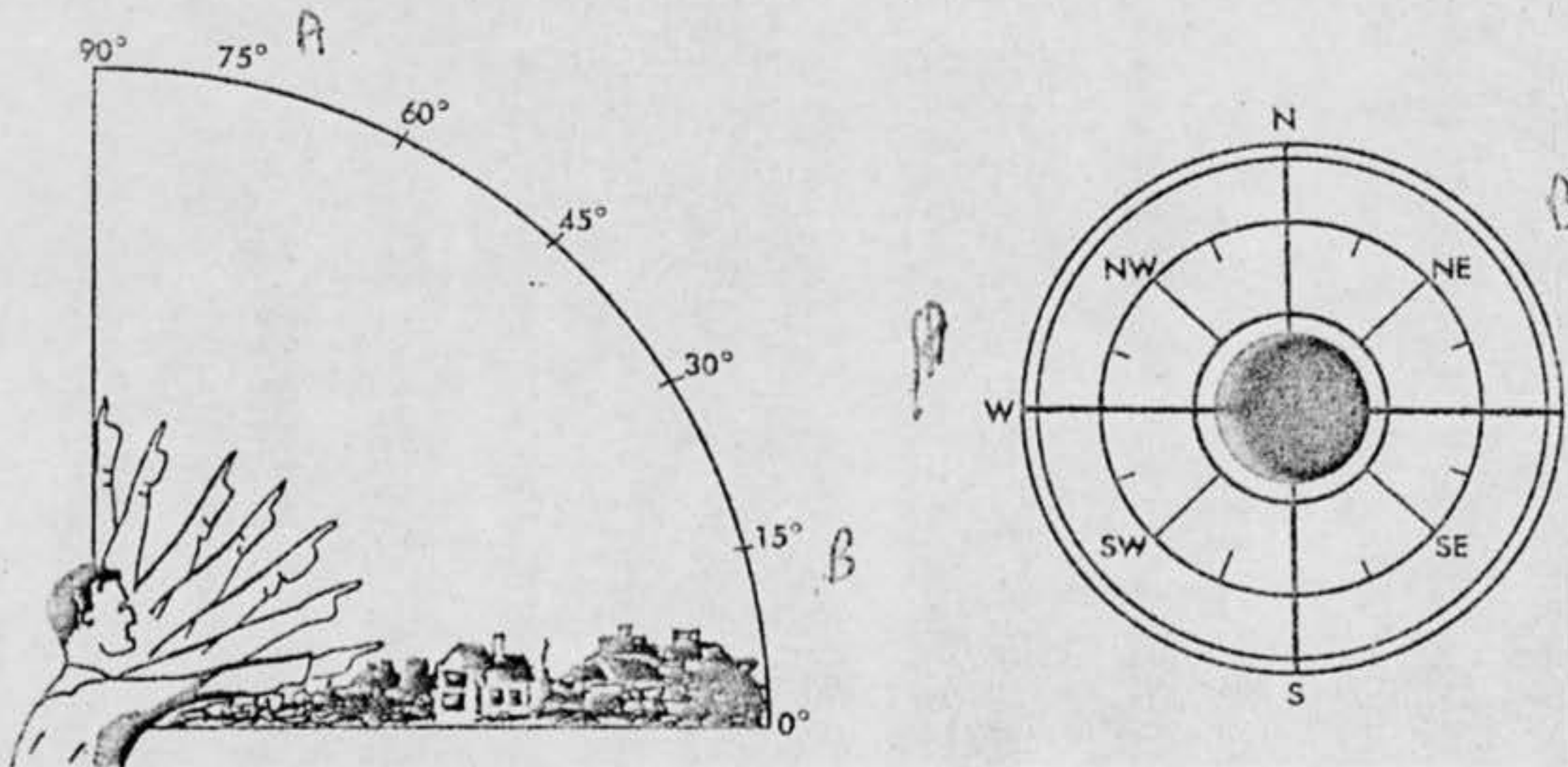

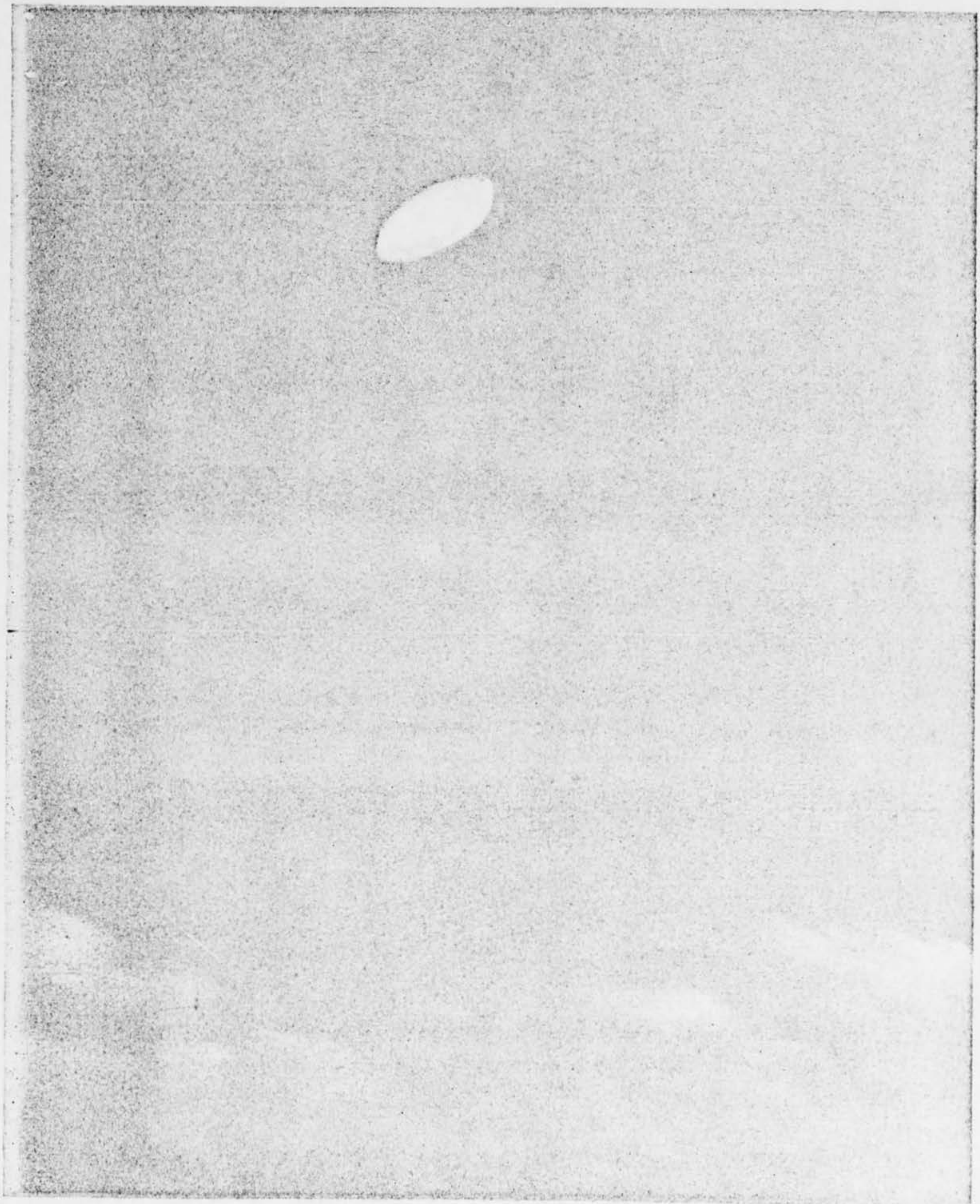

7. SUMMARY: At approximately 0220 hours, 17 April 1967, I observed five (5) large, illuminated, oval shaped objects, traveling in a close formation and at a very high rate of speed across the sky. At that time, I was on the roof of the Saigon Field Office of the 524th MI Detachment, located at 205/8 Vo Tanh, Saigon. I first saw these objects near the horizon to my left and watched them cover the entire field of my vision in what I believe to be less than five (5) seconds. During that period of time, the objects traveled from where I first saw them, near the horizon to my left, passed almost directly over me at what seemed to be a very great height, and then moved out of sight behind a cloud formation at the horizon to my right. The sky was partly cloudy but at the time of the sighting, the area of the sky over which they traveled was very clear with the exception of a few small patches of scattered clouds, which they seemed to be above. As the objects passed over these clouds, they were obscured from my vision until they emerged on the other side. I also observed that, as they passed between my line of sight and a star, they covered the star and blocked out its light until they had passed. This indicated to me that the objects were not transparent. It was apparent that they were not any form of conventional aircraft due to their size, shape, rate of speed and the fact that they

made no noise audible to me. Prior to the sighting of these objects, I had been observing various conventional aircraft, both propeller and jet powered, and there is no question in my mind that they were a great deal larger than any craft I have ever seen in the sky. They were also traveling at a rate of speed which I would estimate to be at least five times greater than jet powered aircraft I have ever seen. They were too distant and traveling too fast for a detailed description to be possible. I was only able to see that they were definitely oval in shape and glowed a steady white. They seemed to be in a vertical attitude, rather than horizontal, in relation to the earth, and their formation slowly fluctuated as they passed. Approximately five (5) minutes after they passed out of sight, several jet powered aircraft, which seemed to be at a high altitude and traveling very fast, came from my far right and to my back as I faced the same direction as when I had seen the ovals. They proceeded to the area where I had lost sight of the objects, and upon reaching that point, they turned to their right and pursued the same course as the objects I had previously sighted. These aircraft were not in a formed pattern but were scattered. I'm not certain of the number of planes but there were several. I have never held any opinion concerning unidentified flying objects. Neither have I ever seen any previously. However, I believe that these objects were space craft of some kind. I am convinced that they

Dear Major Quintanilla:

As reported, this case is completely unidentified and much additional information is called for. It is inconceivable that military intelligence would not have looked further into this case and, therefore, I should like to request that any further information garnered in this case be forwarded to Project Blue Book. Saigon must certainly have 24 hour radar coverage: were these objects picked up by radar?

Witness indicates that jet interception may have been involved, although objects were traveling "at least five times faster than any jet-powered aircraft I have ever seen". The objects were oval in shape and were traveling in a vertical aspect. In view of the fact that the witness "was known as a stable, mature member of the 524th Military Intelligence Attachment," it appears that all persons concerned in this sighting should be further interrogated. I further suggest that a copy of this sighting be transmitted to the University of Colorado group.

Since the source of this information was himself a member of a military intelligence detachment, it appears all the more incomprehensible that this incident was not followed up in considerable detail.

Enclosed is a detailed report covering UFO sightings at Sharon, Massachusetts on 18, 19 April 1966. Witnesses included members of the Sharon Police Department.

The investigation was carried out by NICAP MASS SUBCOM Investigators John O'Neill and Ernest Reid and submitted to the Chairman for final processing.

Many good quality UFO sightings are coming to the attention of NICAP MASS SUBCOM. Priorities are being set due to the number of reports being received. A constant check is being maintained with the Sky-Lite Advertising Company so that we know the flight path of the advertising plane often mistaken for a UFO. A recent report being worked on involves possible radiation. Ernest Reid, Civil Defense Radiological Monitor for his area, measured radiation 100 times greater than background radiation for the sighting area. Samples were taken and Radiation Physicist Peter Poulsen is making a thorough analysis to determine the significance of the above normal readings. A full report will be forthcoming. Mr. Walter Webb of Boston Museum of Science was appointed lead investigator for this particular sighting and all inputs will be sent to him for final report preparation.

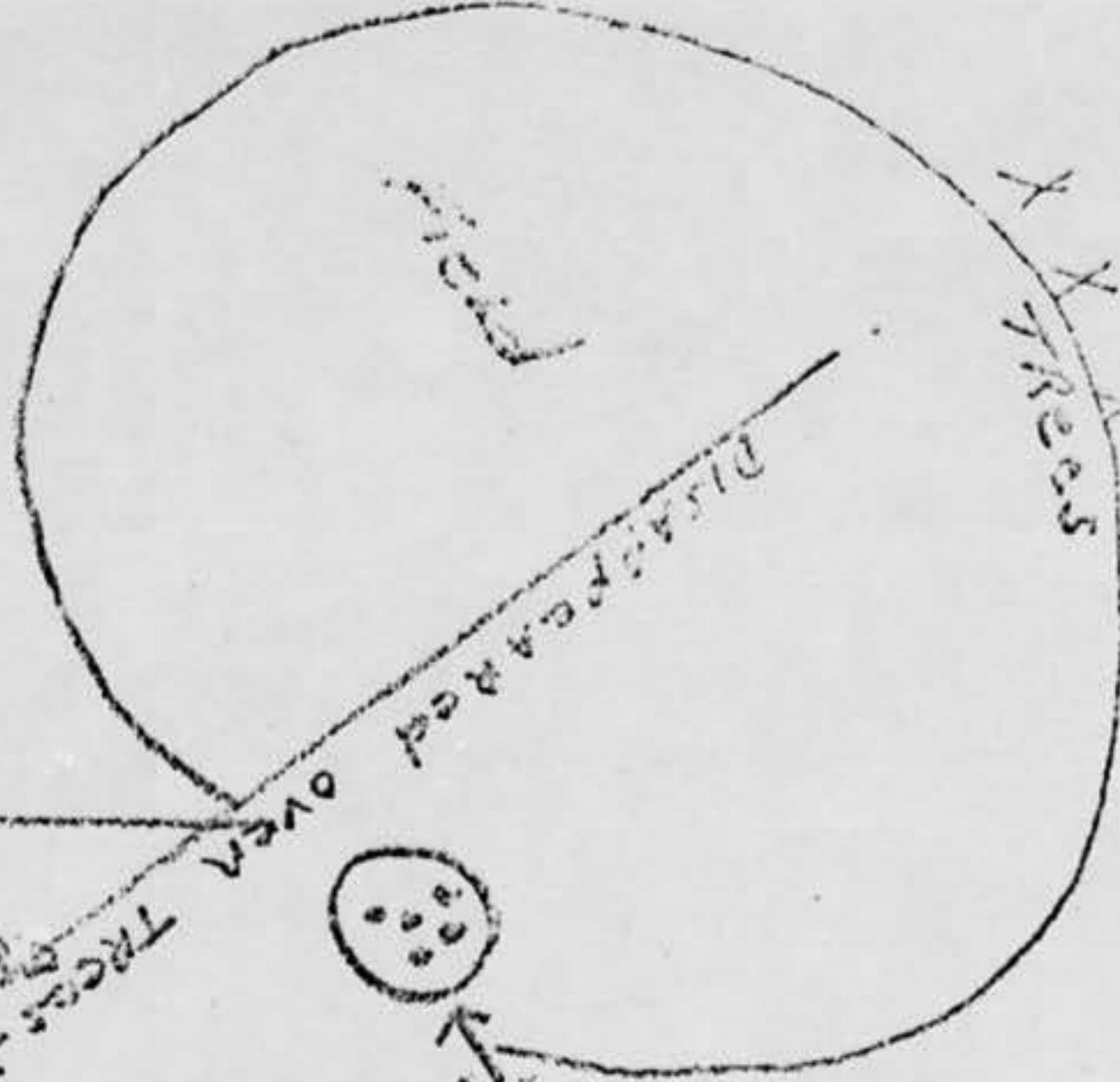
As the result of a telephone call recieved from Mr. and Mrs. Mav, 1 Holly Lane, reporting seeing strange objects in the sky, Officer Jones and I responded to Holly Lane. On arrival we found Officer Testa and Sgt. Donovan observing distant lights in the sky with Mr. and Mrs. Mav and Mav's sister. About 12:10 a.m. Sgt. Donovan and Officer Testa left and Officer Jones and myself watched these distant lights with the Mav's. One of these objects was in a north westerly direction, similar to a star, only brighter, it appeared to be rotating and changing colors from red to white to green. There was two other objects of the same discription in a in a south westerly direction. While we were observing these distant lights, Mrs. Mav said here it comes, or there it is, and we all looked in an easterly direction. The object appeared to be a falling star at a great distance, only three times the size of a star, and brighter. Within a matter of two or three seconds the object appeared over the tree line on the easterly side of the field in front of Mav's house about 200-300 yards away from us and approximately 500 feet up, when the object was hovering over the tree line it appeared as a very bright, large mass of white light with a ballish appearance. The object made no noise what-so-ever, and did not cast any light onto the tree line or ground below. The object stopped and hovered over the tree line for approximately two or three minutes, while the object hovered a plane passed over in a northerly direction, when the plane moved off the object started to move across the field in front of us in a south westerly direction. As the object passed in front of us I viewed a red light in front and a red light to the rear that remained on (not flashing) and a wide section of white light extending from red light to red light and appeared to be inside lights. I concentrated on trying to see inside of the object for any figures or movements but failed to detect any sign of life or figures. I feel as if I did see inside the object. The object disappeared as it went over the tree line in a south westerly direction.

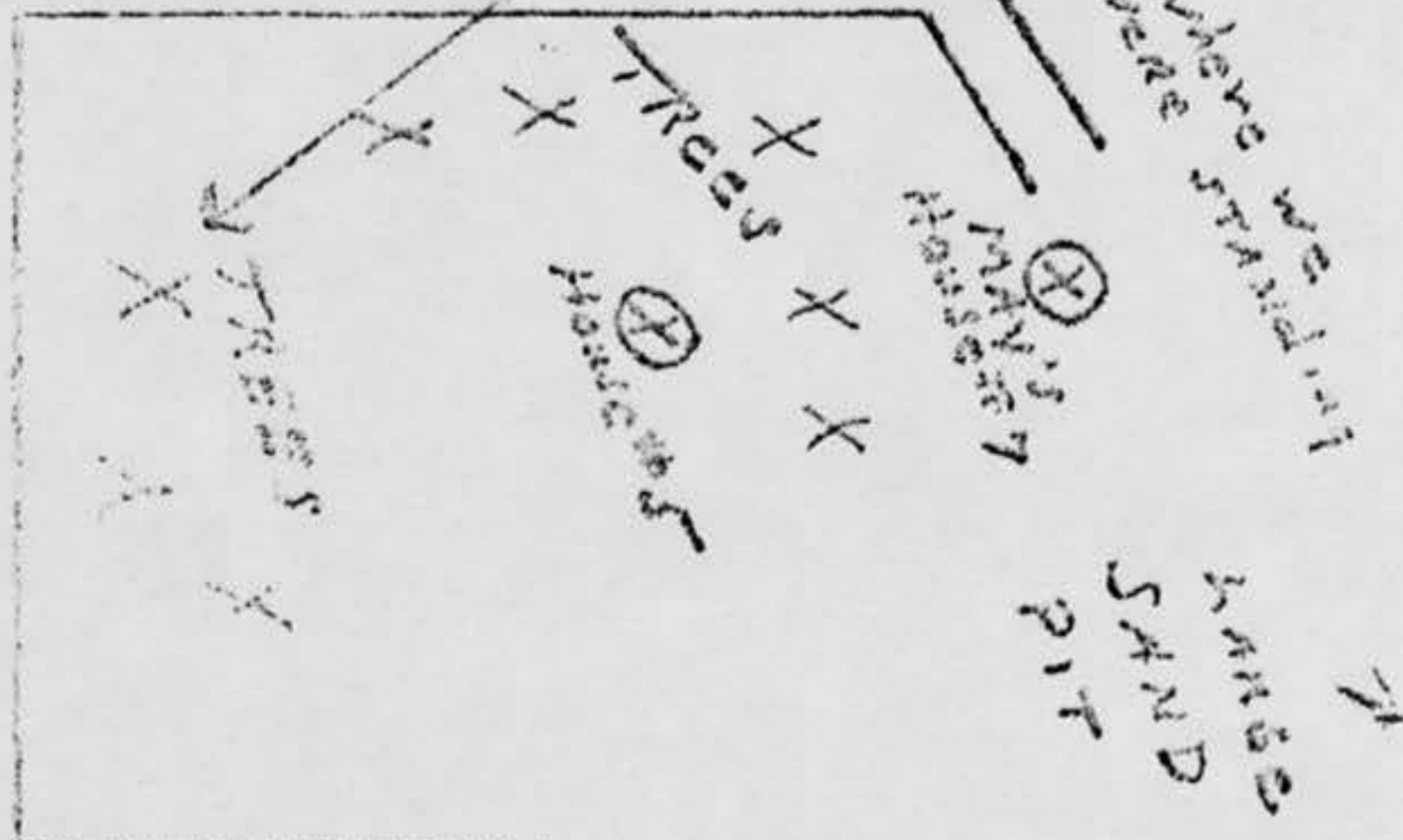

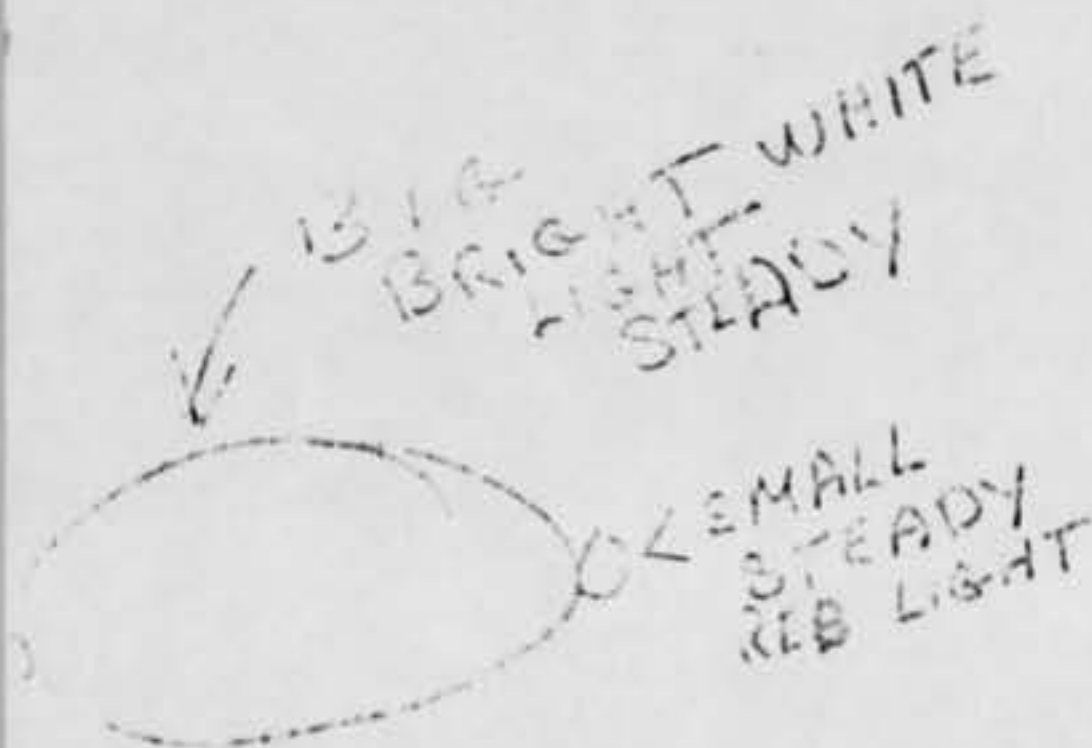

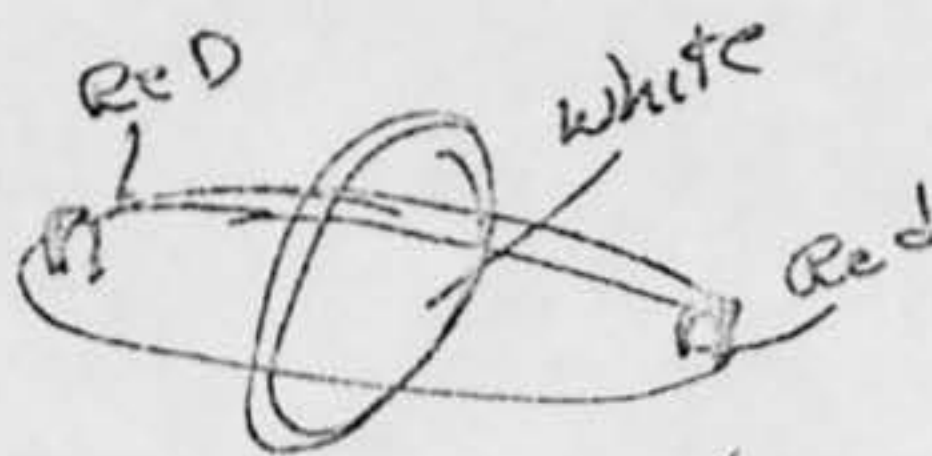

UFO Sightings Reported 20 April 66 Quincy

The mysterious, red, white object with red and white lights was seen in the same area as other sightings of mysterious lights last Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and again on Monday.

Purple Glow

White Light

James H. May, 106 Empire St., Quincy, said he saw a purple glow in the sky last Tuesday night. This was about 10 p.m.

There is his description of the sighting: An oval shaped object, purple in color, was high in the sky and gave forth a pulsing light.

The boy said the object seemed to be about 100 feet high in the sky and moved in a westerly direction. The sound was high and pulsing.

Sharon police said a cruiser to the area and policemen said they saw a purple glow. The boy's father, James H. May, said he did not see the object but he heard the same sound reported by his son.

In Sharon at 2:15 a.m. only Mrs. George May of 7 Holly Lane reported a huge oval shaped

She said about 14 other persons including several young children saw the object. Against a hazy and cloudy sky, she said, a huge white glow was visible. The object was about 300 to 500 feet above the ground.

The sighting made by her was basically the same as that reported Monday but with this one new detail: a concentrated white light was visible.

Mrs. May described what happened this way: It looked like a searchlight. The beam was small and then gradually increased in size. The concentrated ray of light never hit the ground, she said.

Quincy Police Chief Dennis P. Dolan said this morning there was a report of an object in the sky at 4:20 a.m. He said, "Someone saw some kind of light and the police saw it but did not know what it was. It is rather foggy. It could have been a star. Maybe there is something there."

At least two families in Quincy's Germantown section, spotted disc-shaped objects in the sky shortly before midnight.

Ten Minutes

Mrs. Arthur Shields of 28 Empire St., who watched through binoculars for about ten minutes said there was one large disc hovering above two smaller discs.

She said they displayed flashing red and white lights and made no sound.

"They were swinging like a pendulum," said Mrs. Shields who also pointed them out to her family.

A neighbor, Mrs. Richard Whitman of 25 Empire St., saw the unidentified flying objects independently.

Mrs. Whitman said she saw one object with red lights.

"It gradually disappeared beyond the trees and houses," she said.

Mrs. May, in an interview with The Patriot Ledger this morning, related: "It was back again early this morning. One woman took a picture with a little Polaroid camera. We are all wondering if it will come out."

"Last night my mother-in-law was on her way home and spotted a light in the sky near the Sharon Box company (Route 27) and telephoned us. Then she came back."

Big Flash

"We saw a great big flash of light like a search light and it appeared as if someone was holding a flash light."

"This lit up the whole sky. Police came to the area last night but just missed it. The object hovered above the trees for several minutes. Then it started to move. The object looked more like a huge duck egg. It was foggy and you could not make it out too good. There also was a haze. There was no noise at all."

Sharon Police Chief Albert R. Horan Jr., released for publication an official police report which was prepared by Sgt. Bernard Coffey.

Police Report

The sighting was made also by Patrolman Frederick Jones. This was on Monday night at 11:30 p.m. Here is the report.

"After receiving a call from Mr. and Mrs. May of 7 Holly Lane who reported seeing strange objects in the sky, Jones and I responded to Holly Lane."

"On arrival we found Patrolman James Testa and Sgt. Harold Donovan observing distant lights in the sky that were changing colors from red to green to white and appeared to be rotating."

"About 12:10 Patrolman Testa and Sergeant Donovan left as we were viewing these distant lights with Mr. and Mrs. May and a sister, a very bright, large mass of white light appeared traveling in a south westerly direction out of the east."

"The object stopped and hovered over the tree line on the easterly side of the field in front of the Mays' house for approximately three to five minutes."

"At this time the only visible

object was the huge bright mass of white light approximately two to three hundred yards away and about four to five hundred feet up.

Lights Described

"As this object hovered for a couple of minutes, an air plane passed in a northerly direction. As the plane moved off the object started to move across the field in front of us we viewed a red light in front and a red light to the rear that remained on at all times (it was not flashing) and a wide section of white light that extended from red light to red light and appeared to be inside lights."

"We reported the incident to the Otis Air Base and they said they would give the report to the proper investigating committee to evaluate and be in touch with us at a later date."

"At no time did any noise come from the object, it remained completely silent."

"Nobody can tell me I didn't see it," Sergeant Coffey said today of the Monday sighting. "Mr. and Mrs. May, his sister, Sergeant Coffey and I saw the object off in the distance." This was late Monday night.

Rotating

"We saw it rotating. It came close. I felt as if I did see inside but saw no movement whatsoever. It was rotating. At first it appeared to look like a falling star but was three times bigger," he said.

He continued, "In less than five seconds the thing went over the trees and just held there. It appeared quick and disappeared just as quick. I did see it and it is fantastic."

"This is the closest a sighting has been made."

Sergeant Coffey estimated the height of the object at 500 feet above ground. He asked, "How could swamp gas have a red light in front and one in back? It was not blinking. I could see the curvature of these lights which would indicate the object was oval."

'Like Windows'

"The curvature of the lights appeared like windows. As I said, it looked like a falling star and then in less than five seconds was just above the trees."

"A plane could be seen off in the distance and was flying quite high. The object then disappeared. After the plane passed the object resumed movement again. Quite possibly this thing stopped because of the plane."

"The object was visible for about five or seven minutes and all I can say is it was fantastic."

The U.S.O. sightings covered by this report took place on the (2) consecutive nights of April 18 and 19, 1968. Additional Information

1. A study of the area around the May property was made on April 23rd. by Investigator O'Neill. The surrounding fields are for the most part dry, level, and without sign of swamp areas although a brook and drainage ditch does go through the area within a half mile. A few Cranberry bogs are located in the area to the northwest of the May area at a distance of $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

The tree line towards which the witnesses were facing in Group Four is about six-hundred feet from the driveway (Holly Lane).

2. Chairman Raymond Fowler has provided the information that the advertising plane which has figured in many sightings in the New England area was not in use on the nights of the 17th, 18th, and 19th. of April.

3. The U.S. Weather Bureau reports for the two nights concerned are as follows:

4. Representatives from the Air Force (L.G. Hanscom Field, Bedford Mass) visited the area on Friday April 22nd. They are said to have talked to the Sharon Police Chief on that date, and we have been told by one of the officers that the Chief has directed that all UFO reports are not to be logged in the usual daily blotter, but a separate record kept of any future occurrences.

5. Although the time and direction of the Group Four sighting seemingly does not lend much probability to misidentification of Astronomical Objects, a study of the positions of the bright stars and major planets (Mars, Jupiter, Venus) was made by Investigator O'Neill. Using the standard reference works in the reduction of these objects to local longitude and latitude (American Ephemeris And Nautical Almanac, 1966 and Norton's Star Atlas 19th. Edition) expected negative results were obtained.

Summation of Sightings

Group One Sighting

Although Mrs. May's sighting of 18 April is not supported by other witnesses, her second sighting of 19 April is in general identical, well witnessed, and during extended interview not contradictory or easily degraded.

Group Two Sighting

Mrs. Keeling's sighting, although not definitely related to the others, is interesting when taken in relation to the statements of witnesses in the other Group of multiple distant lights (see report of Sgt. Coffey).

Group Three Sighting

The same can be said of Mr. Clapp's report as of Group Two above.

Group Four Sighting

The heavy concentration of witnesses in this sighting leaves very little to be said or added. Although the majority of the witnesses are women and housewives, the presence of two experienced Police Officers lends additional credence to their reports.

Some inconsistencies are to be noted in the individual reports. The majority of these concern weather, UFO motion, and general time estimates. It is believed by Investigators O'Neill and Reid that these could reasonably be expected in view of the conditions under which they (the conditions) would both have to be noted and well remembered by the many witnesses.

In our opinion, having taken into consideration the reports of the many witnesses, the general attitudes and apparent intelligence of observers, and the time spent in interviews, the inspection of the area, allowance for astronomical objects and the information relative to the advertising plane, that the reports are both factual and credible.

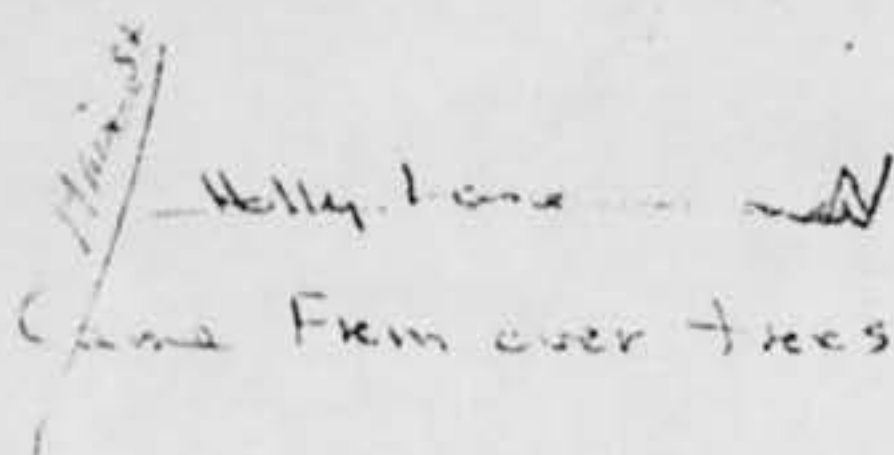

Your recent letter to President Johnson concerning your sighting of an unidentified flying object (UFO) has been referred to this office.

Unfortunately, you did not report your sighting soon enough so that a scientific investigation can be made. We have found that after thirty (30) days, precise details tend to become vague, and an investigation would serve little scientific or technical purpose.

Should you ever sight another UFO, please report it as soon as possible to the nearest Air Force base. Each base in the United States has a UFO investigator, who is in a better position to make an on-the-spot investigation, which usually results in a more accurate analysis.

We are, however, inclosing a copy of the latest Project Blue Book report. By reading it, you may be able to discover what it was that you observed.

As I was driving Southeast toward Reading, Pennsylvania on Route 183, at 8:10 P. M. on April 23, 1967, an extremely fast moving light caught my eye. If it hadn't been for its tremendous speed, about 1200 mph if not as much as 1800 mph (it was moving two or three times the speed of a conventional jet), I probably wouldn't have noticed the object. It was about four miles away and it appeared to be flying from west to east over nearby Mount Penn. The object was very bright (four times as bright as Venus would be on a clear night) and the edges were quite easily distinguishable. It was in sight for one minute or less. The object finally got too far away to be visible.

Upon arriving home some twenty minutes later, I reported that I had observed a UFO to my family (my son in particular, who is a member of the Laymen's Investigation Committee on the Research of Aerial Sightings). My son then went out to observe the sky and noticed a vapor trail in the sky.

Two nights later (25 April 1967) I filled out one of the questionnaires of the Laymen's Investigation Committee on the Research of Aerial Sightings, which closely corresponds with the Air Force's questionnaire. I also used that form as a reference to this questionnaire.

My son's organization reported to me that it had inquired to the local airport (General Spaatz Field), and it had received no reports of jet aircraft in the area at that time.

A few days ago I was given this report and at the same time was shown the Air Force letter sent by Major Quintanilla stating that because of the time lapse, the object might not be identified. I venture to say that I have Never seen an object of this type before.

-- Enclosed is a detailed report covering the sighting of three UFOs at Beverly, Massachusetts on 22 April 1966.

This sighting is similar to the April 18, 19 Sharon, Massachusetts sighting(s) in that it involves 3 UFOs, multiple civilian witnesses and two members of the Beverly Police Department who also witnessed one of the UFOs.

Enclosed as part of this report are signed statements and forms by both police officers. They got a good look at the object as it hovered directly over the Beverly High School and told me they were certain that it was not an airplane or helicopter. Three adult witnesses were "buzzed" by the UFO earlier. It appeared to be hovering about twenty feet above their heads. Other adults called off the scene also witnessed the UFOs. It is indeed fortunate that police officers were called on the scene to investigate and confirm these sightings.

I received a telephone call from Mrs. Claire Medugno, 63 Schier Road, Beverly, Massachusetts on Saturday afternoon, 4-23-66, who told me that many people had witnessed 3 UFOs over the Beverly High School that Friday night. She stated that 2 Beverly Police Officers called on the scene also witnessed one of the objects but when she phoned the police today that they would not admit any officers were involved.

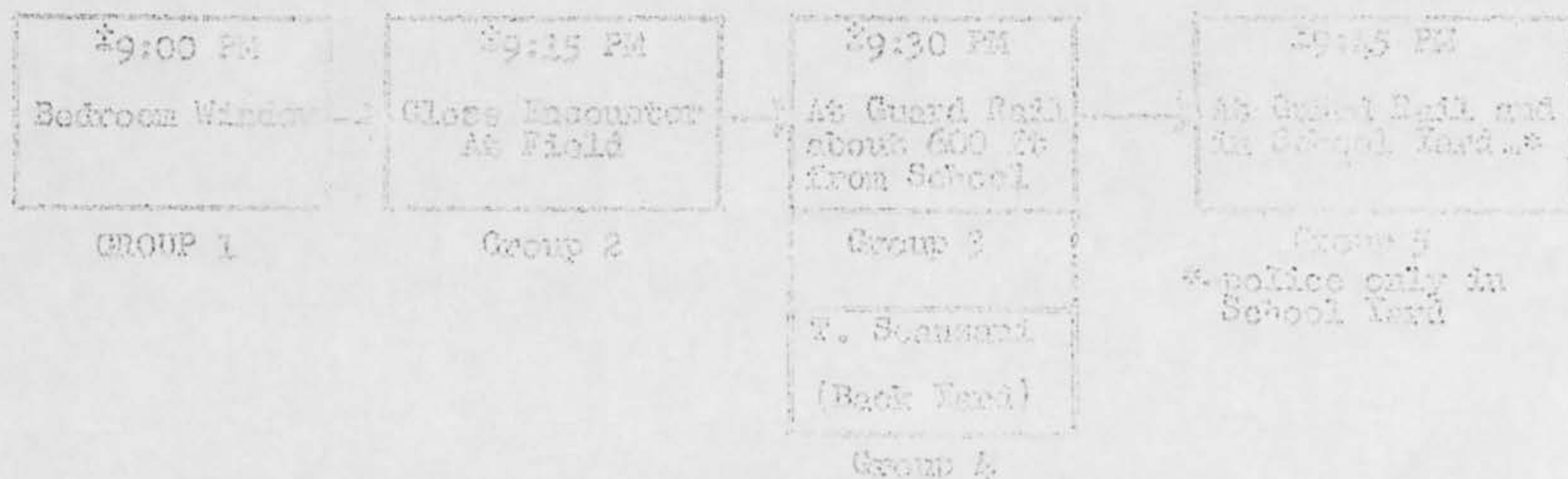
I phoned the police and was told that there was no such report on the blotter except an earlier report on a fireball. I asked who was on duty during the sighting period and obtained the names of 2 pairs of officers who were out on patrol at that time. I phoned and eliminated the first pair narrowing it down to Officers Eossie and Mahon. I phoned them and although they hedged my questions at first, finally admitted that they saw something and agreed to be interviewed.

On the following day, Sunday, 24 April 1966, I interviewed the civilians having them fill out the standard NICAP UFO Report forms and sign them. I then proceeded to Beverly Police Headquarters. At the station I was given the run-around at first but after pointing out that I had been given cooperation by other police departments and that Officers Eossie and Mahon had agreed to be interviewed, the officer in charge ordered the desk sergeant to radio both officers in. Upon arrival they were told to tell me exactly what they witnessed. We were moved to a private room and I interrogated them for about an hour. They filled out and signed NICAP UFO Report forms and wrote and signed brief statements regarding the sighting.

SIGHTING ACCOUNT

The sighting started about 9:00 PM EST when Nancy Modugno, age 11, noticed a blinking light shining through her window as she lay in bed. She looked out the window (WNW) and saw a football-shaped object the size of an automobile flashing blue, green, red, and soft white lights. It made a soft "whizzing sound" as it passed along Schier Road, at first seemingly only 40 feet away. It seemed to be right over the houses on the other side of the road. It then passed behind some trees about 50 feet away (trees estimated 40-50 feet high) heading W toward a large field behind the Beverly High School. The lights seen through the trees seemed to indicate that it was landing in the field.

Nancy was terrified and ran downstairs to tell her father, Angelo Modugno, who was watching TV. His wife, Claire Modugno was in the adjoining apartment next door visiting Barbara Smith with Brenda Maria. Barbara and Brenda left Claire and came over to use her telephone to order pizza pie. When they came in they found Nancy in a hysterical condition and her father, Angelo, trying to calm her down. They tried to calm Nancy by telling her that what she saw was probably an airplane. They looked out the window toward the field and saw some flashing lights and told Nancy they would walk down to the field and prove that they were from an airplane to reassure her.

They all went next door and got Claire and Barbara, Brenda and Claire went down Schier Road to Herrick Street and down into the field. They sighted 3 brilliantly lit objects flying in a circular pattern. The objects would circle and hover and then proceed to circle. One was over the High School, one to its left more distant and higher and another to the right, also more distant and seemingly over where the Bannock Research Buildings would be off Route 128. They only hovered momentarily and then started the circular motion again at great speed. The witnesses said they look as if they "were playing tag". Brenda, half in fun, began waving her arms motioning them toward them. While watching one that was completing a circle over the school it started to come toward them. Barbara and Claire began running back to Herrick Street, while Brenda, momentarily unaware that they were no longer standing behind her, was shouting that it was going to pass right over them. At this point, Barbara and Claire stopped and looked around to see the object hovering about 20 feet over Brenda who was screaming and covering her head with her hands. (She thought it was going to squash her!) Brenda, suddenly realizing that Barbara and Claire were not with her, began running to them. Looking back they saw the object hovering and then moving back toward the High School in a semi-circular pattern. As they ran along Herrick Street they could see it over the school.

The trio ran to Claire's house and phoned Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lesser and Mrs. Theresa Scannetti. The Lessers came right over. Theresa could not leave the house. (She says she saw one of the objects pass over her home as she watched for them from her backyard). Then, Barbara, Brenda, Claire, Angelo, Nancy, and Mr. and Mrs. Lesser all ran down to the corner of Herrick Street and Salem Road where there is a guard rail overlooking the field. Two UFOs with the same changing colored lights were hovering at a high altitude at a good distance. They looked a little larger than stars but the lights were brilliant. One UFO was

seemingly hovering directly over the High School and looked as if it were only 15 - 30 feet above the roof. It was oval shaped and flashing a very bright Red light along with dimmer Green and White lights. Mr. Lessor ran back home and phoned the Beverly Police station.

Officers Dennis Bossio and John Wilson arrived on the scene shortly in a cruiser and jokingly enquired - "Where's the airplane?" - The group excitedly pointed the object out to them as it circled slowly over the school at very low level. Both officers were visibly shaken. They watched a few moments and then got into the cruiser and sped down Salem Road and into the backyard of the High School. "As they came into the school yard, the object moved off slowly into the SW toward the United Shoe Machinery Corporation and disappeared from view. No one saw how the other two objects disappeared because they were so attentive to the closer one."

One of the things that amazed all the witnesses was the fact, that except during Mahey's initial sighting, the objects made no noise whatsoever. Brenda told me that even when the object was directly over her she heard no noise, not even the air seemed to be disturbed. All are familiar with airplanes and helicopters. Soon after the sighting both civilians and police saw and heard the airplanes and a helicopter near the area. Their running lights were nothing like the lights on the UFOs.

PERSONAL STATEMENTS/REACTIONS

NANCY MODUGNO

- "The object had four lights, red-blue-green and a lamp color. It looked like a football but was the size of a car. On the top it had no windows. The front was pointed. I was terrified."

BARBARA SMITH

- "The first time I saw the object was from a window. It was just a flashing red light that moved slowly along the sky, then behind some trees and was lost from view." The next time I saw the object there were 3. They were flying in a circular pattern. Then they just seemed to stop and hang for a few seconds, then they would move with great speed. While watching one that was completing a circle, it started to come toward us. (with Brenda & Claire, Group 2) I started to run. Then a friend (Brenda) called - "look up it is directly over us" - so I looked up and stood still in surprise. I saw a large round object just roof-top level. It was just like looking at the bottom of a plate. It was solid. I saw no flashing lights as I did when they were farther away but I did see a halo-like light that went across the front. The color (of the object) was a grayish-white. I heard no sound at all but I felt this thing was going to come down on top of me. (It was like) a giant mushroom. I was fascinated, stunned, unable to think and automatically found myself running away from it.

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BRENDA MARIA

- "This object appeared larger and larger as it came closer. The lights appeared to be all around and turning. The colors were very bright. (When overhead) - All I could see above my head was a blurry atmosphere and brightly lit-up lights flashing (not blinking slowly around. I was very very excited - not scared - very curious. I would not have ran at all except for the fact the object got too close and I thought it might crash on my head."

CLAIRE MODUGNO

- "It came right toward me - looked very brilliant. It was greyish - seemed very smooth and seemed to take on the Red and also the Green from the very brilliant lights. I was terribly scared."

(Note: Claire was so frightened as she ran from the object she urinated. This was disclosed to me by the others during the interview much to the embarrassment of Claire!)

OFFICER BOSSIE

- "On April 22, 1966 at 9:45 PM I was sent by the station to Salem Road near Beverly High School on a report of a UFO. We arrived and were met by a dozen or so people who were all excited on seeing objects. I saw an oval red object just ahead of me. The lights were bright and were blinking all the time. I heard no noise and the object seemed to stay at the same height and just move away very smoothly. It headed toward the United Shoe Machinery Corp. and in the area of the Airport."

OFFICER MAHON

- "At 9:45 PM on orders from the station, I went with Officer Bossie to Salem Road, site of the Beverly High School on a report of a UFO. On arrival I observed what seemed to me to be like a LARGE PLATE HOVERING OVER THE SCHOOL. It had three lights - Red, Green & White but no noise was heard to indicate it to be a plane. This object hovered over the school and appeared to almost stop. The lights were flashing. The object went over the school about two times and then went away."

SPECIAL POINTS OF INTEREST

1. During Nancy's initial sighting, Angelo Modugno said lines appeared on the TV screen obliterating the picture momentarily.
2. The U.S. Coast Guard informed me that they received no UFO Report during the sighting period nor was their helicopter airborne.
3. The Sky-Lite Advertising was flying in the Salem, Derry, Manchester-New Hampshire area between 9:00 and 10:00 PM according to manager Joseph Bodina so his plane is ruled out.

EVALUATION:

The witnesses were mature and sincere. They were not seeking publicity. I encountered the usual problems when interviewing them, such as their not understanding some of the questions and filling them out wrongly; Some of them had seen the object at different time periods and places which confused them; directions and times were approximate; etc. I had to telephone them to get some of the details straight. The data extracted from the UFO Report Sheets and from personal conversations is substantially accurate.

The description of the UFO is similar to other reports being received and follows the characteristics of the true UFO. I hope to go back into the area and check out rumours of other witnesses. I did go back and take compass readings and photographs. I also hope to get tape recordings of the witnesses description of the UFO at close range.

All witnesses are very familiar with the conventional running lights, configuration and noise of conventional airplanes and helicopters. Many aircraft flying into Logan Airport and Beverly Airport are witnessed by them daily. Two airplanes and a helicopter were witnessed over the area shortly after the UFOs disappeared and were easily recognized. The close-up encounter by Brenda, Barbara and Elaine rules out known aircraft. The other civilians and the two police officers were convinced that what they witnessed was not conventional aircraft. The object(s) were round, solid, carried rotating red, green, white and blue lights. The one sighted at close range looked like it was constructed of dull gray metal. They were noiseless. My own opinion is that this sighting represents a good unknown.

ADDENDUM: (Mrs. Robert Lessor watched the area until after midnight and observed the following at 12:15 AM, 23 April 1966)

"Just one object appeared over the High School. It was mostly white. When it was about to stop it turned green. When it stopped it was white like a star. It went around the same circle 3 times and stopped 3 times in the same spot (over school). Then it went away heading north."

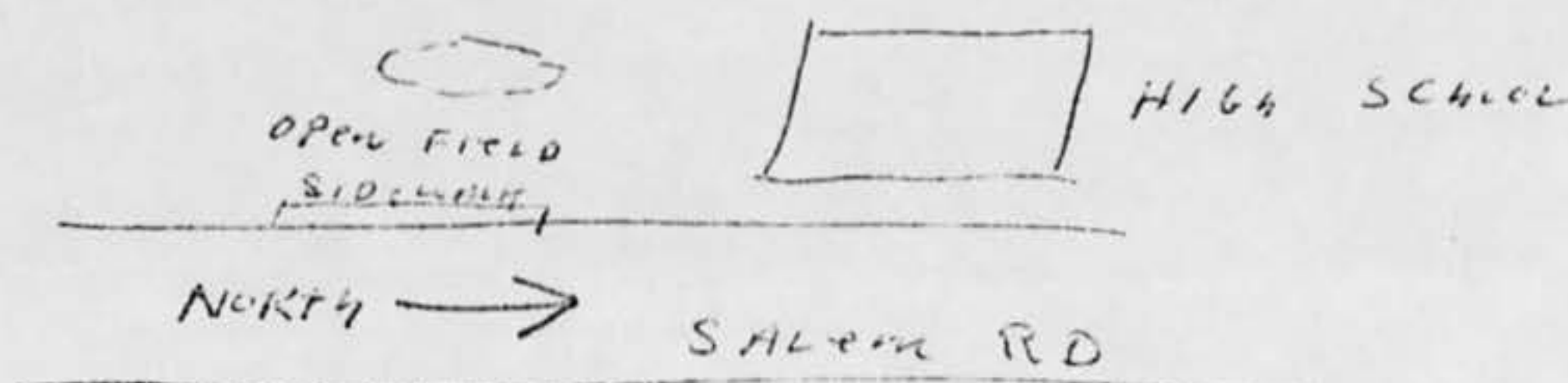

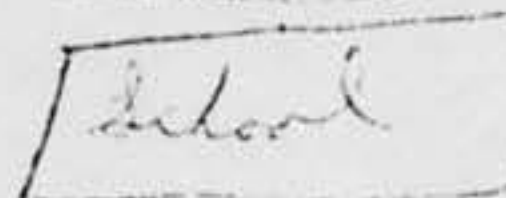
